A compliance report will be produced at the end. Additionally, through the "Help Lives Walk" program, we are enhancing mobility support for physically challenged individuals from below-poverty-line families.

Equitable, Quality Universal health coverage Implementation research Project for optimizing comprehensive primary health care through Health and Wellness Centres (EQUIP-HWCs) in Chamarajanagar district, Karnataka is an ICMR funded multi-centric project. The Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) held a twoday workshop was attended by the EQUIP-HWC team, including Dr. Tanya, Dr. Yogish, Dr. Kaushik, and other members from IPH, Chamarajanagar. The event gathered teams from various states collaborating on the EQUIP-HWC project. A training session was conducted on using REDCap for household surveys, focusing on data collection and management skills. Dr. Yogish presented the survey strategy, emphasizing methodologies and timelines.



PHC4UHC: Pathways in 2 Indian states



The PHC4UHC project seeks to explain the pathways through which reforms/programs in primary healthcare (PHC) contribute to Universal Health Coverage. Indian Institute of Management Bangalore is the lead institute and partnering institutes are - IPH Bengaluru, Ekjut, The George Institute for Global Health India. The project started in July 2023. In the last quarter, the IPH team contributed to a realist review being undertaken by the teams. The team screened articles for inclusion and extracted data.

Education domain - Public Health Teaching Hub for Innovation, Networking and Knowledge (PH THINK) Lab

This quarter was buzzing with activity at IPH Bengaluru for our team starting from a delightful name change and logo. We held workshops, hosted interns from institutions across the country and facilitated exposure visits. Our flagship elearning course on 'Public Health Management' (ePHM) was also launched on the SWAYAM NPTEL portal and is available for free.

22 participants joined the hands-on three day 'Data analysis and visualization workshop' and spent an entire weekend immersing themselves under the brilliant facilitation of Dr. Biju Soman (Professor, Sree Chitra Tirunal Institute for Medical Sciences and Technology), Dr. Arun Mitra (Faculty, All India Institute of Medical Sciences - Bibinagar) and Dr. Yogish C B(Faculty, IPH Bengaluru) with short pulses of lectures followed by practice.



- The Education team supported the execution of the blended workshop on 'Realist Evaluation' where 27 participants attended both online and offline formats. Dr. Prashanth N Srinivas and Dr. Pragati Hebbar facilitated this workshop under the banner of the REALISE project to enhance capacity building in realist evaluation methodologies in early to mid career public health professionals.
- IPH Bengaluru hosted about 25 internships under different projects during this quarter
- The PhD student group at IPH Bengaluru successfully completed the Annual PhD workshop, which is a networking
 and skill building initiative that they lead for early career researchers in the field of public health. About 20
 participants joined these sessions and traversed topics ranging from grant writing, constructive supervision,
 projectand time management, data governance and positionality, mental health and health communication.
